The target audience is pediatric health care providers including pediatricians, family medicine physicians, nurse practitioners, and other health care professionals interested in these topics.

1. Implement into their practice the updated knowledge of Autism Spectrum Disorder;

3. Implement into their practice an understanding of the complementary and alternative therapies that exist and better able to have an informed discussion with parents that may have tried these therapies with their child with ASD;
4. Refer families to available community resources;
5. Apply how to evaluate and manage the care of an individual with Asperger Syndrome;
6. Implement into their practice the steps to assist youth with ASD and their families in making the transition to adult care.
